

What Can I Expect What Does it Mean to be Saved?

To be saved means that you have now been adopted from Satan's family into God's family. While you were part of Satan's family you served Satan by living in a manner that was contrary to, and in opposition to, God's standard. But now as part of God's family you are called to serve God through Yeshua (Jesus) in a way that is contrary to, and in opposition to, Satan's standard.

Satan's standard is to break God's commandments. God's standard is to break Satan's commandments. For example, when you did drugs, or engaged in sexual acts outside of marriage, you were in alignment with Satan's standard and in opposition to God's. But now that you have been made part of God's family - to be in alignment with God's standard and in opposition to Satan's standard, you have now been called to be against drugs and against sexual acts outside of marriage.

For upholding Satan's standard your reward was death, but in pursuing God's standard, your reward is now life.

And just like any child who has been born into a family, it takes time to learn the family rules and abide by them. When born into Satan's world, you knew nothing of His standard.

Satan's standard of covetousness, lying, stealing, sexual perversion, gossiping, ven-geance, hatred and so on, were things you learned how to do over the course of many years. And because you had a sinful nature, those lessons were very easy for you to learn.

But now as part of God's family, it is like you have been born all over again. That is, concerning your knowledge and

understanding of God as a new member of His family, is like the knowledge of an infant.

As such, it is going to take time also to learn God's standard, and to learn how to successfully abide by it.

Some sins you may overcome very quickly. If your sin is an addiction, then you may very well be delivered from it instantly, and from the lifestyle that goes with it. But you may also still have other sins outside of your addiction and previous lifestyle, like gossiping, or un-forgiveness, of wrongly judging others, impatience, or some other unrelated sin, that you may not be delivered from instantly because for some reason God wants you to learn something from the process of struggling against the sin while learning to overcome it.

And like that infant, you are going to first learn how to crawl, and then walk, and then run; and you are going to stumble and fall at times in the process until you master your new life in Christ.

Then in due time, you will look more and more like Yeshua (Jesus), and less and less like the child of Satan you used to be. That transformation for you may happen fairly quickly. For others the process of transformation and of renewing the mind may take years. But if you are truly saved, if you truly did make Yeshua (Jesus) your King, and truly did hand over the reins of your life to Him by submitting yourself to His will, then the renewing of your mind and transformation of your life will absolutely take place, for nobody can meet the Savior in truth, and not have their life transformed after that encounter.

What Do I Do After I Have Been Saved?

Be baptized, read the Scriptures, then learn to do whatever God says to do, and

learn to overcome whatever behavior He forbids. Find like-minded believers to fellowship with, and compare everything you hear with Scripture and accept what lines up with it, and reject what does not line up with it. Do not expect perfection in others, but rather growth in yourself. The Church is a hospital for the spiritually sick who are all in different phases of healing, so be patient with them in their healing process. Also, be aware that once you are healed of your sin, that you were not healed in order to look down on others for their sins, but rather, to be a doctor to help them overcome and be healed of their sins.

What Can I Expect in My Life as a Believer Who Has Been Saved?

As a believer, you will be Satan's enemy. In Yeshua (Jesus) the war has already been won in your favor,

But you will still need to fight out the battles necessary to learn your life lessons, and to overcome. And you will taste victory at times, and feel defeated at other times.

But the end result of it all will be inner peace, love for others, purity of heart, joy, and a hope that cannot be taken away.

Becoming a believer has cost many people their lives, caused them to be imprisoned and their families to shun them. It may cause former friends to hate you. You may be discriminated against at work, lose your inheritance, or be spoken of as a traitor.

That is because there is a cost for becoming a believer - a cost for being a light in a darkened world.

But as light utterly consumes darkness, even so shall His reward for you utterly consume any and all costs.


